



## SUMMARY OF CRST COVID-19 EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDERS APRIL 20, 2020

### Executive Order #2.1 – Health Safety Checkpoints

- Regulating all entry/exit points on the Reservation for the purpose of preventing, tracking, and limiting the transmission of the COVID-19 virus within the exterior boundaries of the Reservation.
- COVID-19 Travel Plan required from every traveler. Form is used to screen any potential COVID-19 infected individuals and to know of their contacts in case they later test positive for COVID-19.
- Info sheet handed out to every travel to inform them about COVID-19 and tell them how to avoid spreading the disease.
- A non-resident may be restricted from entering onto the Reservation if he has traveled to COVID-19 areas, since he could pose an imminent and serious medical threat to the health and welfare of the members of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe.
- If a traveler does not agree to complete the Travel Plan and he is attempting to come on to the Reservation, he will not be allowed to proceed through the Checkpoint. If a traveler does not agree to complete the Travel Plan and he is attempting to leave the Reservation, he will be allowed to go but then will not be allowed back on to the Reservation until the COVID-19 public health emergency has subsided.

### Executive Order #2.2 – Mandatory Quarantine

- Upon return to the Reservation, mandatory 14-day quarantine for any resident who travels (a) to any area outside of South Dakota or (b) to any area in South Dakota where there is community spread of the COVID-19 virus.
- First choice is for them to quarantine at home. If they don't stay home, they can be picked up and forced to stay in a tribally-run quarantine site.
- Either Health Dept or the Courts can issue a Quarantine Order for a resident who should be quarantining for 14-days but is still out in public. Law Enforcement will pick them up and take them to tribally-run quarantine site. They will be required to stay there until their 14-day period is done. There will be security guards at the quarantine site to make sure they stay put.

### Executive Order #2.3 – Stay-at-Home

- Travel, either solely within the Reservation or into or out of the Reservation, is only allowed for "Essential Activities."
- Essential Activities is more broad for travel solely within the Reservation. Examples: Health and safety, necessary supplies, outdoor activity, care of others, protection of closed business, or to go to work in businesses such as: health care and public health, human services, essential infrastructure, essential governmental function, farming, ranching, auto repair and supply, animal care, gas stations, banks, electrical, plumbing, HVAC needs.
- Travel that requires exit or entry onto the Reservation to or from out-of-state or a community-spread county in South Dakota is more limited. Only the three allowed purposes listed on the Summary of COVID-19 Checkpoint Policies dated April 20, 2020, will be allowed to or from these areas.
- Requires social distancing if a person must go out for an essential activity.
